PRESIDENTS MESSAGE:

Mark your calendar for our Annual Membership Barbeque on July 15th . We will be providing burgers, hotdogs and all the fixings. Please bring a side dish to share with others. We will also be having our annual Dessert contest.

This year along with the Barbeque we will be trying a new event. We are calling it "Vendor Day". We are attempting to bring businesses in to the park that have items that you may need and want to purchase to improve your camping experience. Some businesses are: Car Ports 4 less, Rainier Custom Yurts, Sign makers and more.

We will also be allowing members to have yard sales at your sites. Please contact the office if you would like to have a yard sale at your site. The office will put together a full list of the sites that are having yard sales.

IMPORTANT ITEMS:

- 1). **RESPECT OUR STAFF !!** Lake Trask employees are there to help you, they work hard to ensure that we enjoy ourselves. I was in the office when one of our staff members was yelled at and threatened. They deserve to be treated with respect and kindness. They do not set or change the rules. If you feel the need to vent to someone you can call me or another board member. Members that are repeatedly disrespectful to our staff will be band from the office except by appointment only.
- 2). Please remember to keep your pets on a leash at all times.
- 3). This year we have already had several cell phones come up missing . One was stolen out of the game room in the lodge last weekend (we have reviewed the video cameras and are attempting to identify the individuals (and their dog) who stole the cell phone). Theft is theft, it will be prosecuted. If you find something turn it in to the office.
- 4). If you have an **emergency** at your site and are unable to get cell service, please set off your car alarm. Members should respond if they hear a car alarm continually going off.
- 5). Forms (reservations for courtesy site, site sales, etc.) that are needed at Lake Trask can be found on our web site. Please print the forms and fill them out completely.
- 6) Please remove all floatation devices from the lake before you go home.
- 7). Please to not leave your boats parked overnight in the boat launch areas. The spot next to the swimming area is for launching your boat or for parking for a brief time only.

- 8). It has become apparent that members that invite friends and relatives to the park don't understand that it is your responsibility to let your guests in and out of the gate. This is a rule that needs to be followed, it isn't the employee's responsibility to let your guests in and out of the gate. Our security system cameras have been tampered with by someone in the park we have a photo of the person when we figure out who this person is, if they are a member or a guest of a member the board will take action which could be a fine or suspension from use in the park.
- 9). If you have a boat with a motor on a trailer, it can't be used in our lake and we prefer you do not bring into the lake. If you must bring it with you, it has to be store on your site as there is no storage area in the park for it. If this is not adhered to the boat and trailer will be removed at owner's expense.
- 10). There seems to be a lot of members driving around the lake letting their children ride with the tailgate Down, hanging out the windows, sitting on the back of the tailgate and also letting their children ride out side of the vehicles standing on the running board of the vehicle. The laws that apply in the state about this still applies on Lake Trask property. We sure don't want any children hurt or run over from falling from a moving vehicle, so please abide by the law.
- 11). Children that are riding their bicycles must ride with caution and when they come to lake Trask Drive check to make sure no cars are coming as there has been instances where the child rode out in front of a car driving on the rode and almost go hit, there again the laws that apply outside of Lake Trask still apply inside of lake Trask. Please do not park bikes at the front of the Lodge, There is a bike rack on the side of the lodge that bikes can be parked at.
- 12). When riding ATV's it is a requirement that you ride with a helmet, You must have your site number on your ATV's and you are not allowed to ride around the park, you are to ride from your site to the gate going out of the park and you must obey the speed limit, Lake Trask drive is the only road in the park that is 10 miles per hour ALL other roads is 5MPH.
- 13). When you purchased a membership site at Lake Trask, you were given a copy of our Handbook & By-laws. It is your responsibility to read and adhere to them. There has been an increase in these regulations being violated. Be aware there are policies in place to issue citations for violating our rules and regulations. We are going to be issuing citations, If a citation fine has not been paid after 90 days, your membership can be suspended. Please follow the rule and make Lake Trask a fun and safe place to visit.
- 14). No smoking of any kind allowed in the all Bathrooms, Lodge and Pool area.

Treasurers Report:

Hi Everyone! Hope everyone has been enjoying the nice weather and camping! We met with the attorney in May and we found out we have been doing something incorrectly. When a member is behind on their account at the lake we have just turned off their gate card. What we actually have to do is have the board vote to suspend their membership per by law 2.6

2.6 SUSPENSION OF A MEMBER: A member may be suspended by three fourths vote of the Board of Directors for action detrimental to the good of the association, including violation of any provisions of these by-laws or other rules and regulations established by the association. Any member who has been suspended shall not have the right to enter the land owned by the Lake Trask Timber Trails Association. However, he/she may, bring the matter before the general membership at the meeting in April or September, for a vote on the Board's suspension of membership. Member with the issue must pay for cost of mailing to membership for notification of meeting. The matter will be put to a minimum of 25% vote of members at large, in good standing for a vote. Two-thirds of the members at large must vote in favor of reversing the decision of the Board in order for the member to retain membership. If not, then the Board's decision to revoke membership is thereby ratified and finalized and the revoked member shall have no further recourse. In the interim, the suspended member shall not be allowed on Lake Trask Timber Trails Association property without the prior written consent of the Board.

So at the June meeting we did this for the first time. Those members were then sent letters letting them know that their membership is suspended until their account becomes current. If anyone has any questions about this feel free to email me at mibellazobo@gmail.com

General Board Meeting

May 20, 2017

Present: Patty Boyd, Dee Clark, Greta Chehrehgosha, Donna Pfingston, Joan Andrews,
Jason Moberg, Greg Thomas

Absent: Scott Lester, John Tannehill

Meeting was called to order at 10:06 AM.

Patty Boyd called the meeting to order and asked for any additions or corrections to the minutes from the previous general Board meeting. Greta Chehrehgosha made a **motion to accept the minutes as read** and Joan Andrews seconded. Minutes were approved with 6 yes votes.

Operation Report: Gary Dail states the water system was tested and Chloroform was detected. The water is safe to drink. The state requires we flush the system, and it will be done beginning May 27, 2017. Our water system is tested on a regular basis.

Haydee Diaz (A3-19) asked regarding electrical meter reading, is it done on the first of the month and did they get read on the first of May? Gary says yes the meters are read on the first of the month, however this month he read them on the 30th of April. Haydee says we need dates on the electric bill. We cannot add the dates meters are read to bills according to the company we contract our software through. Electrical usage bills will be sent out quarterly. Haydee asked what company do we use and why can't we have PUD bill the members? Patty explained that PUD supplies our power and sends only one bill to the lake, they do not break the main bill down for each members usage. Haydee feels her bill was inaccurate. She plugged her cord in on the first day we had power. She states she wasn't in the park and did not use her power. Patty will get copies of the gate card records for the billing time in question for her. Haydee only had her humidifier on and she was also gone for two and a half months. Yet she was billed for November, December, January and February. She was in the park in March. Haydee feels nothing will be proved with the gate card records.

Joyce Krauter (C4-26 & 28) stated her meter is at 1300 kws. She is conserving use as it is so high. Patty will meet with Joyce after the meeting and discuss this. Jason Moberg (E3-09 & 10 & 11) plugged everything in, checked the meter reading and then unplugged things one at a time to gauge electrical draw. His refrigerator drew a lot of power. He will help anyone who wants to do this. Joan Andrews (A8-15 & 18) stated that PUDs rates are higher than other power companies. Joyce Krauter asks does PUD adjust the meters? Patty will ask Barb Ellis to see if there is any difference in the PUD bill for Trask as a whole verses members individual meter readings. Gary Dail says RV manufacturers have different things on their RVs, devices to monitor equipment and this draws power. He says the system in his motorhome is checking regularly and his battery has to recharge a lot.

Gary is trying to get a logger out to remove trees, however he is having a hard time getting anyone to call back or commit to coming out to look at the trees.

Patty reminds members to clean up their sites, Memorial Day is our first big week end and "companys coming" so let's make the park look great!

Newsletter and Sunshine report: Yvonne needs articles for newsletter by May 31. We had 8 new members join our lake family. She has been our office manager for four years now!

Treasurer's report: Greta has been calling members with delinquent accounts and is working with everyone to become current. There is about \$3,000.00 still due for yearly dues. She has rewritten letters going to delinquent members. Signers on Bank of America account have been updated. South Sound Bank account is \$102,208.82. Haydee Diaz (A3-19) asked where our money is spent each month and Greta referred her to the budget spreadsheet in the agenda packet. Yvonne does not include the spread sheet in the online newsletter as it is a public forum.

Joyce Krauter (C4-26 & 28) asked if letters would be going out for upcoming bills? Yes, there will be a bill in June for the electrical utility fee of \$60.00. Can we address lowering the utility fee? Yes. The property taxes went up \$17,000.00; therefore we will have to raise membership dues to pay the increase.

Jason Moberg made a **motion to accept the Treasurer's report as read.** Joan Andrews seconded, motion carried with 6 yes votes.

Audit committee: Don Brewer met with the committee and everything is in good shape.

Budget and Finance: Greta stated that committee member Joyce Krauter resigned. Greta made a **motion to appoint Jenny Davey to the Budget and Finance committee.** Jason Moberg seconded and motion carried with 6 yes votes. The committee met a couple weeks ago.

President Patty Boyd asked the membership if the General Board meetings could be moved to 1:00 PM.

The Executive Board members met with our attorney, Rob Hoss-Wilson regarding our by-laws. He suggests we "clean up" our bylaws and move several over to the handbook. It breaks down to the difference between *By-laws* and *Policies*. *By-laws* are governing documents and protect our association. Our Handbook is the *Policies* (rules) for our association. In the coming years we will be re-working our By-laws to bring them into conformity. The Electrical By-laws were approved by a Special Vote and do not to be changed.

Darlene Dail (D1-2 & 4) is concerned if membership sites where members are living in shelters and have no RV on their site is a violation of our By-laws or a County regulation. Joan Andrews (A8-15 & 18) states that electric can only be connected to original equipment in RVs. Pier blocks make the RVs movable but electrical must be on trailer. Haydee Diaz (A3-19) asked what difference is there if appliances are full size or installed in the RVs? Patty will look for an answer.

Haydee Diaz (A3-19) stressed her concerns for safety in the park. She has brought several dead trees to the parks attention and nothing has been done. She says someone must be responsible for the dead trees. Board member Greg Thomas restated that Gary Dail has been calling loggers in an attempt to get the trees removed. He simply cannot get anyone to give him a bid, and he would like three bids before he gives the job out. Patty Boyd says we are all concerned about this. Haydee Diaz asks is it going to get done?

Katie Schaffner (A2-20 & 21) asked the procedure for getting dead trees removed? Yvonne has a form to fill out. Dead trees are removed by the Association and the wood belongs to the Association. Hazardous trees on another member's site are dealt with on a case by case basis.

ATV Club: Greg Thomas has volunteered to chair the ATV club. Are Trask ATV members allowed to ride on Green Diamond trails? ONLY if you buy a membership to the Shelton Dirt Riders Club. It is a \$500.00 fine from Shelton Dirt Riders if you are caught without a membership to their club. Katie Schaffner (A2-20 & 21) asked if the Trask ATV riders still need ID cards on their ATVs? Yes, and only riding to exit gate. Steve Remeto (C5-23 & 24) asked does Lake Trask have designated riding areas on Green Diamond property? No.

Greg Thomas (B3-27) gives “Kudos” to Jason, Gary and Keith for the great job they are doing in the park. The BBQ shelter cover has new supports, the fishing dock has new seats, the pool has new concrete on the deck (the old, cracked concrete was original and probably put in in 1973).

Will the pool be open? Yes! President Patty says she is going in, water or not!

Greta Chehrehgosha (E5-01) asked is a permit required for a pre-built shed? Jason Moberg says yes, we need to make sure it is in keeping with our By-laws. Darlene Dail (D1-2 & 4) asked do you inspect them to make sure work is done right? Jason says there is an authorization form and it has to be signed off. *When* in the building process is the work checked? Greg Thomas says small ones are not checked until finished. The large shelters, RV covers are checked while in progress.

Haydee Diaz (A3-19) wants to know what member in A section is building on his site with the log poles? It is possibly a cover for an RV. Haydee wants to know if it is in keeping with dimensions in our By-laws? There is no height regulations in the By-laws. Some RVs are very tall and need a higher cover.

Greta Chehrehgosha says the Trask Site Sales Facebook page is growing! There are 2-3 people every week who want to come out to the lake and check it out. Greta reminds everyone that the 10% discount on association sites ends May 31, 2017.

Patty Boyd says that pre-sale site inspections need to be done before a site can be sold. This makes sure site is up to By-law codes.

We have added 40 new members since the park has opened back up. WELCOME to the Trask family!

Are we selling the courtesy sites? Patty says no.

Joyce Krauter (C4-26 & 28) asked if the money coming in for the special electrical assessment will be going lower with more members? Any extra money goes to pay down the principal on the loan. Do we want to continually raise and lower the amount charged based on the changing membership number? Site transfers do not change the bottom line.

Tom Simmons (C4-20) asked how much money do we spend on fish dumps? We budget \$3,000.00 for fish dumps. Tom asks are we stocking the lake, he has not seen the eagle here lately. Yes, we have already stocked the lake once this year.

The fishing derby was a great success. We lost a long time member, Jackie Lindberg, weeks before the derby. Jackie loved the lake and donated big fish every year. In Jackie's honor, from this point on the big fish award will be named after her. This years big fish was a whopping 6 lbs. 9 oz.!

Kids Fishing Rodeo: The first ever kids fishing Rodeo will be next week-end. We will be setting up a netted area at the fishing dock and stocking 300 fish. There will be hot dogs, chip & pop for sale, a kid oriented raffle, and a drawing for each age group.

Donna Ehret (A6-18 & 19) asked is there a limit on the fish? To give everyone a chance to catch a fish, we are asking that fisher kids catch two fish, then get back in line to fish again. We need volunteers and easy up canopies for the day. Darlene Dail (D1- 2 & 4) suggests notifying the members who live on Lake Road about the Rodeo at the fishing dock. There will be no access for cars or boats during the Rodeo.

There will also be hayrides, Bingo at 7:00 PM Saturday, and movies in the Lodge on Sunday. Thank you to Mark and Toni Johnson for donating a popcorn machine! Danne Brown has a friend with an antique tractor for the hayrides. Greta asks for volunteers to help the kids fish (worms on hooks!).

We will also be selling raffle tickets for the Special Electrical Assessment for \$1.00 each.

Slide: To clarify, our liability insurance will cover a slide on our dock. It does not have to be commercial. The last slide we had lasted about 10 years. There will be a sign reminding swimmers weight limit on slide is 250 lbs.

Darlene Dail (D1-2 & 4) asked do we choose between a slide and a new ice machine? Greta explained that at the Budget and Finance meeting she was under the impression that a new slide would cost about \$15,000.00. Since we won't need that much for the slide, there is enough money for both in the budget.

Haydee Diaz (A3-19) says we have no money for the roads, but money for other stuff, safety first. We all agree safety comes first, and we are working on getting all the potholes filled in, it just takes time. Greg Thomas explained that the record rains did a lot of damage to the roads. It is a valid concern and is being addressed. Haydee says US Electric took all the gravel out. Greg explained US Electric did what was specified in their contract. Joan Andrews says members can rake gravel back into holes on their loops. Jason Moberg made a **motion to purchase and install a new slide**. Greta Chehrehgosha seconded. Motion carries with 6 yes votes.

Joan Andrews (A8-15 & 18) asks can we recycle cans to offset cost of new slide? Darlene Dail says there is always trash in the recycle cans. Karen Jennings (C3-22 & 23) asked can't loop members manage collecting aluminum cans on each loop? Patty Boyd says Waste Management charges for recycling bins. Let's get the teenagers involved in raising funds for a new slide.

Karen Jennings (C3-22 & 23) asked if we have a loop representative for each loop? Not at this time. Time invested makes a difference. Jason Moberg suggests we advertise a slide fund raiser.

We need an installer for ice machine. Joan Andrews made a motion to raise cost of a bag of ice to \$2.00 each. Dee Clark second, motion carried with 6 yes votes.

Member Appreciation BBQ: This year it will be on July 15. We will have a Vendor day. We will have reps from RV centers, yurts, wood sign makers, picnic tables, etc. There will also be a yard sale. Darlene Dail (D1-2 & 4) asked if we could have yard sales at our sites this year? We could make a map with locations of sales. Ruth Blakeslee (A1-33 & 35) suggests paper plate signs on the street signs directing to sales. Donna Ehret (A6-18 & 19)

is concerned about children and cars. Remember the speed limit is 5 miles on loop roads.
Karen Jennings (C3-22 & 23) says it is a good idea to separate the yard sale from the vendor's sales.

Joan Andrews (A8-15 & 18) suggests putting a sign on back ATV gate reminding riders there is a \$500.00 fine if you are not a member of the Shelton Dirt Riders Club.

Joyce Krauter (C4-26 & 28) asked what do we do with brush at our sites? You can pile it on your site near road and rangers will collect it. Ruth Blakeslee (A1-33 & 35) thanks the rangers for picking up the brush at her site without her asking.

Karen Jennings (C3-22 & 23) asked about the black water tanks. The Board has to establish rules regarding them, then they can be installed. Some rules will be: limiting size, concealing from site, pumping in October each year, ground preparation (sand), containment trays, etc. Darlene Dail (D1-2 & 4) feels membership needs to vote to allow the tanks. Jason Moberg says there will be an agreement for member to sign. The tanks are allowed by Mason County at this time. The informational paperwork will be available from the office. Ruth Blakeslee (A1-33 & 35) trusts the board and says other campgrounds have allowed for years. Patty Boyd stated this is preferable to an in ground holding tank. Greta Chehrehgosha says other campgrounds monitor tanks and have mandatory pumps per site use. Ruth Blakeslee says more leakage comes from the blue boys when they are drained. Jason Moberg says a gauge will be required.

Katie Schaffner (A2-20 & 21) says Thank You for the cigarette ash cans at the lodge.

Jenny says Thank You for the work on the entrance road!

Greg Thomas says if you see anyone speeding, get a description of the vehicle and let us know.

Meeting adjourned at 11:50 AM.

LAKE TRASK ORV/ATV HANDBOOK

FOR THE PURPOSE OF CLARIFICATION, ALL RECREATIONAL VEHICLES DISCUSSED HEREIN ARE DESIGNATED AS NON-LICENSED OFF ROAD VEHICLES All members who desire to operate ORV/ATV's from there sites to the approved gates shall abide by the following Rules and Regulations.

QUIET HOURS ARE TO BE OBSERVED AS DESCRIBED IN LTTTA HANDBOOK.

1. All riders must renew and submit RELEASE OF LIABILITY forms annually- Due by Nov. 30th. This includes member's guests of the site and all minor children.
2. All riding shall be suspended from Lake Trask during a MASON COUNTY TOTAL BURN BAN.
3. Strict enforcement of Speed Limit in the Park and on Access Roads. Must obey one way road signs.
4. ALL ORV/ATV's shall display Placard or Decal on each vehicle, no smaller than 2"X4" to display site number. This applies to any guests of a member as well.
5. Members are responsible for the Conduct and Rules and Regulations to be followed, of their guests and minor children while operating such vehicles within LTTTA properties.
(Minor children 15 and under are to be supervised by an adult on ORV/ATV's.)
6. There will be no excessive idling of any ORV/ATV. ORV/ATV's are to be shut off immediately upon returning to LTTTA site.
7. ORV/ATV shall be ridden to and from approved gates only. There shall be No exit or entrance to the park, from external trails.
8. All ORV/ATV equipment will only have State Approved Modifications i.e. Spark Arrested Mufflers etc... Riders must have recommended safety equipment such as helmets, goggles etc. for the ORV/ATV that is being operated.
9. Violation of Any and or All of these Rules and Regulations may result in fines, suspension of riding privileges and or revocation.
10. ORV/ATV Committee shall review all issues to assess Disciplinary Action to be taken.
